Water Emergency Transportation Authority Awards \$32 Million Contract to Kvichak Marine Industries, Inc. for Two New Vessels

WHO: Water Emergency Transportation Authority (WETA)

WHAT: At its regular board meeting, the WETA Board of Directors awarded a \$32 million contract to Kvichak Marine Industries, Inc., Seattle, Washington, for the design and construction of two 400-passenger, 27-knot, passenger-only ferries. The new vessels will replace two of WETA's 12-vessel fleet that are approaching the end of their useful lives (generally 25 years). The new vessels are expected to enter service by summer 2017.

The Vessel Replacement project is funded through a combination of Federal Transit Administration grant funds, Regional Measure 2 bridge tolls, State Proposition 1B grant funds, and Alameda County Measure B Transportation Sales Tax.
